Dear Tosa West Families,

Once again the month of September has flown by as we make our way into the second month of the 2011-12 school year. Our sports teams have been doing really well, especially our Girl's Swim and Tennis teams. Also at the time that I am writing this Newsletter our Boys Volleyball team is getting ready to play Shorewood for what could be the conference championship. It is great to see so many of our young adults out for extra or co-curriculars. Students who get involved have proven to do much better in their academics.

Our teachers continue to get the most out of our Wauwatosa Wednesdays. These important collaboration opportunities have results in setting new goals for this year. We must continue to improve upon our past performances. Our building goals are as follows:

- WKCE: In Reading: Our students will continue to improve until 95% of all students are proficient or advanced. This year we are looking to improve by 10% from 78% to 86%.
- WKCE: In Math: Our students will continue to improve until 95% of all students are proficient or advanced. This year we are looking to improve by 10% from 76% to 83%.
- MAP: In Reading (53%) and Language Arts (52.5%), 68% of all students will meet or exceed their growth targets. In Math (65%), 72% of all students will meet or exceed their growth targets.
- The ACT composite score in each content area tested will increase from 23.1 to 23.8 and continually increase test participation to 100%.
- The percentage of students enrolled in AP courses will continue to increase each year with all students completing an AP course prior to graduation. 48% of seniors last year took at least one AP course, our goal is for 52% for the 2011-12 school year.

October always offers plenty of opportunities for parents to get involved. This Wednesday, October 5th, our Orchestra will perform at 7:30pm in the Auditorium. The week of October 10th is Homecoming week. We will have our HC parade next Friday starting at 4:15pm. Many of our alumni will be returning for the 50th Anniversary Celebration. This year we will also have the Powderpuff game on Thursday night following the freshman football game at 7:00pm. Finally, Parent/Teacher Conferences were moved up to October this year. Please plan on meeting with teachers on Thursday, November 20th and Tuesday November 25th from 4:30pm to 8:00pm.

The next few months will find many of our students involved in a variety of testing opportunities. Juniors and some sophomores will take the PSAT on October 12, while all sophomores will participate in the Wisconsin Knowledge and Concepts Examination (WKCE) in November, and the ACT sponsored PLAN test in December. The WKCE is the state-wide test that students have been taking for most of their school careers, while the PLAN is specifically designed to help students assess their progress and adjust where necessary on their way to college readiness.

I hope to see you all at school during the next few months for at least one of these events. If you have a question about anything, please do not hesitate to contact me.

Three West Seniors Awarded in 2012 National Merit Scholarship Programs



Wauwatosa West seniors Ellyn Kirtley, Natalie Mullins and Alexandra Utech have been named as Semifinalists in the 2012 National Merit Scholarship Program. More than 1.5 million juniors in over 22,000 high schools entered the 2012 National Merit Program by taking the 2010 Preliminary SAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test. The nationwide pool of Semifinalists, which represents less than one percent of U.S. high school seniors, includes the highest scoring entrants in each state. Approximately 15,000 Semifinalists are expected to advance to the Finalist level and it is from this group that all National Merit Scholarship winners will be chosen.

National Merit Scholarship winners of 2012 will be announced beginning in April and concluding in July.

Our sincere congratulations go to all three students on this outstanding achievement.

What is a CSP?

You may have heard the acronym CSP from one of your students. So you ask "What is a CSP and why is a CSP important?" In addition to help from teachers before and after school hours, cooperative study periods are another option for students to receive academic assistance at West. All full-time teachers have a study period devoted to helping students, including students from other classes, with their homework. For example, if your child has a first hour study hall and his or her English teacher is not available, your child may get a pass from the study hall teacher, another teacher, or someone in the main or guidance offices to go to the CSP room and get the assistance they need. The CSP room is located just inside the entrance to the library.

Each period of the day, the CSP room has teachers assigned from each academic department as well as other subject areas. Our faculty is ready to assist your child with any difficulty they may be experiencing. This opportunity is available to all; ranging from students that struggle with daily demands to students with a rigorous course load. What a great option for any student to help them get the most out of their education.

So, whether a student needs to get back on track, receive help on homework, be supported in tackling challenging content, gain greater understanding of course material, receive guidance for test preparation, and/or simply become more confident with the knowledge they are gaining, ... teachers will be available to help.

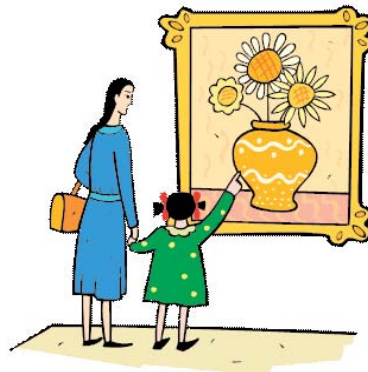
1st Quarter Report Cards

Closed Campus Policy

The closed campus policy that can be found in the Student/Parent Handbook states that during the regular school day, students are not allowed to leave the building without parental permission. That permission can be given for illness, appointments, family business and emergencies. Going out to lunch (except with the parent), going out to buy lunch and bring it back to school, or going home for lunch, are not acceptable reasons to leave school. We ask for your cooperation in adhering to this policy for the safety and well-being of our students. Only Seniors who have earned the privilege of open campus during lunch by good grades, attendance and behavior are given permission to leave campus for the lunch period.

BREAKFAST - A GREAT START TO THE DAY

This year, we need your help to make sure all of our students are fully prepared for academic success. We all know that hungry children have a more difficult time doing their best work. That's why we encourage all students to begin the school day with a nutritious breakfast.

The School Breakfast Program is available to all students at our school every weekday morning. You do not have to register your child in advance. Your child can eat breakfast at school every day or only occasionally. School breakfast makes good sense – for only \$1.50, it provides $\frac{1}{4}$ of your child's nutritional needs, meets Dietary Guideline recommendations, and offers children a chance to eat breakfast with their friends. Students who qualify for free or reduced benefits for lunch, also qualify for free or reduced breakfast. The reduced price for breakfast is \$0.30.

School Breakfast is an ideal solution on busy mornings when kids are running late or parents have to be at work early. Whatever the reason, if breakfast at home is not convenient, please have your child take advantage of breakfast here at school.

Important Test Dates

PSAT/NMSQT will be given Wednesday, October 12, 2011 in the cafeteria at West beginning at 8am.

The PSAT is great preparation for the SAT. Students who take the test in 11th grade, and meet other program entry requirements, may enter the National Merit Scholarship Corporation programs. The cost of the PSAT is \$14 and may be purchased at all (2) lunches beginning September 26th. Upon receipt of payment, each student will receive a copy of the **PSAT/NMSQT Official Student Guide**, which is full of useful information, including a full-length practice test.

We do encourage Grade 10 students to take advantage of this opportunity as well. It is beneficial for younger students to take the test to get a head start on improving academic skills needed for success in college and beyond. They also have the opportunity of experiencing a standardized test. All students who take the test will receive an official grade report. Score results will arrive in late December and we will notify all students/parents of their results. They will receive scores in critical reading, math and writing skills and will see how their scores compare to those of other students across the country.

Students who take the test will **receive free access to My College Quickstart**, an online college and career planning tool that contains an online PSAT/NMSQT Score Report, and more salient information related to their future. For more information, visit www.collegeboard.com or see any counselor.

College bound seniors who have not already completed college entrance examinations or those who wish to retake them should consider using these test dates.

ACT Writing Test

ACT test takers will have the option of taking the Writing Test as part of the ACT Assessment. Students who take this option will be asked to produce a 30-minute writing sample in addition to the other parts of the ACT assessment.

UW-Madison, the University of Minnesota-Twin Cities and Marquette University require the writing test as part of the application for admission. For more information visit uwhelp.Wisconsin.edu/actsatfaq.

Midwest College Exchange Program

The state of Wisconsin recently joined the Midwestern Higher Education Compact which oversees the Midwest College Exchange Program. This program has been available to students in the Midwest since 1994. Through the Midwest Student exchange program students can attend universities, colleges, and vocational/technical schools at a reduced tuition not to exceed more than 150% of the in-state resident tuition rate. Participating private institutions offer a 10% tuition discount.

Current states participating in this program include Illinois, Indiana, Iowa, Kansas, Michigan, Minnesota, Missouri, Nebraska, North Dakota, Ohio, and Wisconsin. This program does not include every college or university in these participating states. Letters of Recommendation for College

As seniors and their parents already know, Wauwatosa West is using Docufide by parchment Secure Transcript (<http://www.wauwatosa.k12.wi.us/schools/high/west/Transcripts.cfm>) as the new method of sending transcripts directly to colleges and scholarship foundations. Wauwatosa West is doing so to comply with the wishes of colleges and universities across the nation. To say this has changed the college application process at Wauwatosa West would be an understatement.

In the past, Wauwatosa West has been able to send applications, transcripts, letters of recommendations and other application material all in one mailing. A record of everything sent was easy to keep track of. With the advent of online applications and electronic transcript acquisition, colleges are receiving parts of the application process through various sources. Wauwatosa West has now lost the ability to confidently know what has been sent and when and what still needs to be sent.

As this is still a learning experience for both the high schools and colleges, attaching letters of recommendation, when required, is one piece of the application process that can be problematic. In consulting with other high schools, Wauwatosa West has decided to handle the letters of recommendation portion in a way that other high schools are using with success.

Students seeking a letter of recommendation are asked to supply to the letter writer an addressed, stamped envelope for the letter, when completed, to be mailed directly to the college, university, or scholarship foundation of choice. This direct mailing will take out of the equation the uncertainty of whether or not the letter has gotten there. It will also ensure that transcripts, when requested by Docufide, will be sent in a timely fashion.

Please don't hesitate to contact the Wauwatosa West Guidance Department with questions about Docufide, letters of recommendation, or the college application process. Our goal is to make this process a smooth one for students and parents.

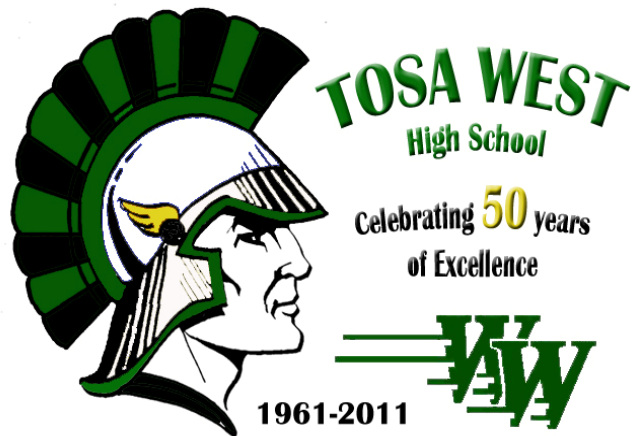
LEARNING NEVER ENDS

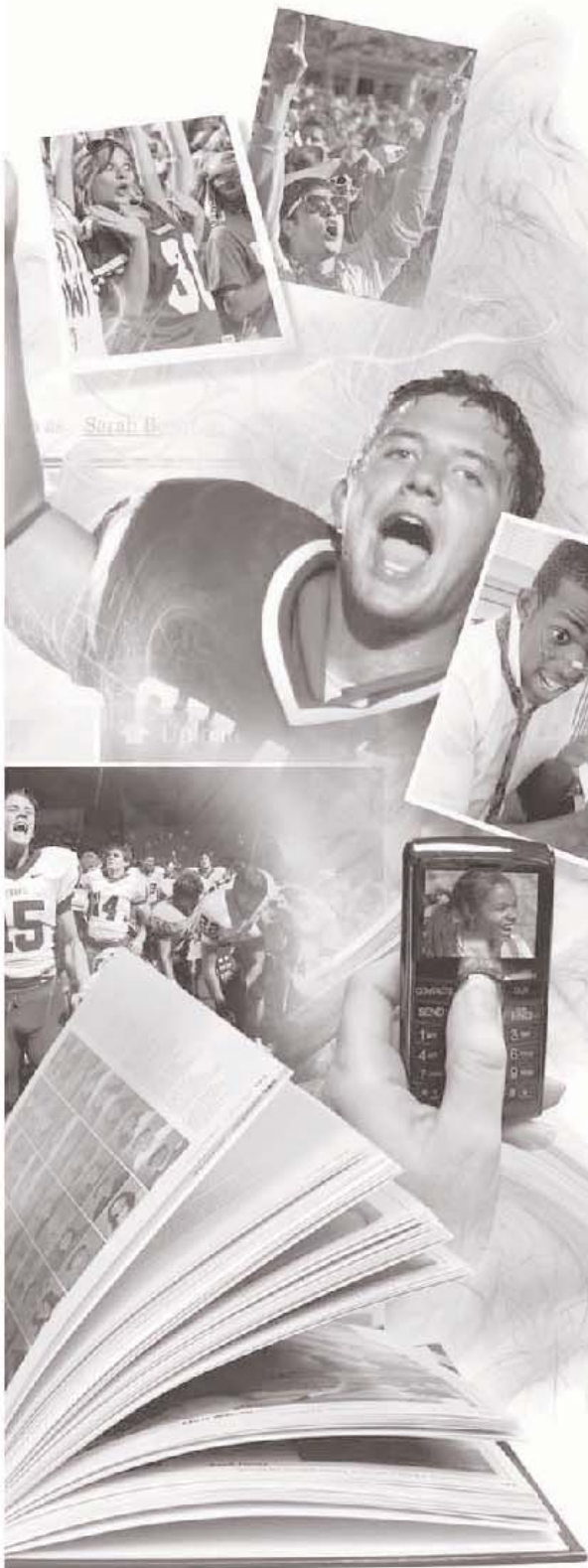

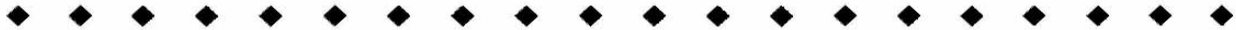

Wauwatosa Secondary Attendance Procedures for 2011-2012

The Wauwatosa School District is required to make contact with parents/guardians in order to comply with Section 118.15 (1) of the Wisconsin School Laws and School Board Policy 5200, which states that all school aged children should attend school. The District further wishes to ensure that all students are given an equal opportunity to achieve to the best of their abilities. Therefore, the following procedures will be followed to inform both the parent/guardian and student.

Parent Excused Absences:

According to State of Wisconsin statutes, and Wauwatosa School Board Policies, students must attend school full time until the age of 18 unless legally excused. The legal reasons for an excused absence by Wauwatosa Schools are:

1. Personal illness
2. Serious illness of a member of the immediate family requiring the student to assist at home
3. Sudden family emergencies
4. Religious observances
5. Appointments with medical specialists when the appointments cannot be made outside of school hours
6. Attendance at a funeral of a relative or a friend
7. Special family observances
8. Family trips that can only be taken during the school term
9. Required legal appearances

In addition, Wisconsin Statute 118.15 (2) c states "a child may not be excused by a parent or guardian for more than ten days in a school year." Therefore, notification will be sent to inform parents when the ten excused days have occurred. A medical excuse for any following absence may be required or the day will be marked as a day of truancy for any other occurrence.

At any time throughout the school year, if you need to report an absence or have an attendance question, please call 414-773-3002.

Unexcused Absence/Truancy all or part of a day:

If a parent/guardian does not contact the school about their child's absence and reason, the child will receive an unexcused/truancy mark.

1. After three unexcused/truancy marks a letter will be sent home to notify parent/guardian of the concern
2. After five unexcused/ truancy marks, a school support person will call parent/guardian and the student will meet with an Associate Principal and School Resource Officer to discuss the importance of attending school
3. The next intervention will take place if the student reaches seven unexcused/truancy marks. A second letter will be mailed home which will contain a date and time for a meeting to further discuss the attendance issues with parent/guardian
4. A final letter will be sent at ten days indicating that a municipal citation for habitual truancy will be issued by the School Resource Officer (SRO)

As a parent/legal guardian it is your obligation to call for absences and provide explanation for absences. It is our obligation to inform you by letter when the absences begin to reach the number that cause concern. Many times, parents or guardians are unaware of the total number of days their child has been absent. We know you realize regular attendance is a necessary factor in achieving success. Work missed can never be made up in a completely satisfactory manner because the value of class activities is missed forever. It is our goal to work with all families to help support their students in a manner that will help them achieve excellence in the classroom.

Tardy to School:

Progressive school measures will be taken after a student's second tardy. Consequences for being tardy to school will occur after the second tardy (such as detentions, lunch detentions, Saturday detentions, loss of privileges, etc.).

1. When a student is tardy to school three times, school will make contact with the parent/guardian to let them know that it is a concern
2. A second call home will be made once a student reaches their seventh tardy to school
3. A citation will be issued by the School Resource Officer when a student is tardy ten times

Again it is our goal to work with all families to help support their students in a manner that will help them achieve excellence in the classroom. At any time throughout the school year, if you have any concerns or need to talk with a school staff member, please do not hesitate to call us. We look forward to working with you this school year.
