Good evening Wauwatosa School District Families -

After further consideration, the Wauwatosa School District will no longer be holding classes on Monday, March 16.

Our original plan was to use Monday as an opportunity for staff to cover the online learning plans with students. However, after our original announcement, a number of parents reached out to express concern about sending their children to school next week. And, as we have witnessed over the past several days, it is highly possible that the circumstances of this rapidly changing situation will change again prior to Monday.

Early next week, you will receive additional communication regarding the process of picking up needed technology and materials to support students' digital learning during our period of closure.

Late this afternoon (Friday) Governor Evers also mandated all Wisconsin schools remain closed until at least April 6. As we comply with this directive, district officials will continue to assess the situation and seek guidance from local and state public health officials as we determine the date on which classes will resume.
