

The Reverend Monsignor David J. Malloy

Throughout his years of service in the Catholic Church, Monsignor David Malloy has touched the lives of countless individuals in a positive way. During his time walking the halls of East High School to the halls of the Vatican, Monsignor Malloy has always been a true source of guidance and inspiration. Today, Monsignor Malloy is the General Secretary of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (the USCCB), a position he has held since 2006. As General Secretary, Monsignor Malloy oversees a staff of some 300 priests, deacons, nuns and lay people. The General Secretary also serves as liaison between the Conference and the Papal Nuncio, the Vatican's ambassador to the United States. Monsignor Malloy graduated from East High School in 1974 and Marquette University in 1978. He studied for the priesthood at St. Francis de Sales Seminary in Milwaukee for one year and then at the Pontifical North American College, Rome, and was ordained a priest for the Archdiocese of Milwaukee in 1983. After serving as an associate pastor in Racine, he studied in Rome for service in the papal diplomatic corp, serving as secretary to the apostolic nunciatures in Pakistan and Syria. He also served as secretary to the Mission of the Holy See to the United Nations in New York. Monsignor Malloy was serving in the Prefecture of the Papal Household at the Vatican prior to his appointment to the USCCB. He became USCCB Associate General Secretary in 2001. Monsignor Malloy holds a doctorate in theology from the Pontifical Gregorian University, Rome, as well as a licentiate in canon law from the Pontifical University of St. Thomas, also in Rome. He speaks Italian, French and Spanish.
